We are building an assessment culture focus. This will help for the students and us to look at it as an assessment of their learning, and not a TEST! It will take time for an assessment mindset to develop, but that is the goal of fostering an assessment culture; a measure of learning and progress to guide their learning, not an end game. The Fall PSAT will serve as a pre-assessment of their learning, where the Spring PSAT will serve as a post-assessment of their learning for this year.
