Frequently Asked Questions about Monroe's Beginning Instrumental Music Program



In what grade can my child begin?

Monroe Public Schools offers beginning instrumental music to 6th grade students in our elementary schools.

What instruments are taught?

String: violin, viola, cello, bass

Band: flute, clarinet, alto saxophone, trumpet, trombone, percussion

Does it cost anything?

There is no charge for instruction or transportation. Students are expected to provide the instrument and book. Please attend our Informational Meeting/Rental Night on Thursday, Sept. 28th so that you can learn about renting or purchasing an instrument. Cost varies depending on the instrument and/or the rental plan. Some school instruments are available for loan at no charge when there is a need although choices of instruments are limited. If you already have an instrument at home, please make arrangements to have it checked over to determine if repairs are necessary before class begins.

What book do we need?

Essential Elements 2000 for Band OR Essential Elements 2000 for Strings

The book needs to be instrument specific. (clarinet book for clarinets or violin book for violins)

How do I get books and instruments?

Representatives from various school-approved music stores will be present at the informational meeting on Sept. 28 at Monroe Middle School and will have instruments and books there for your convenience. If you can't make it, call or visit the following stores and they will be happy to help.

When and where do classes meet?

All beginning instrumental music classes are taught in the music wing at Monroe Middle School from 7:50 – 8:40 AM. All classes will begin on Monday October 2nd.

Brass will be in the cafeteria. Woodwinds will meet in room 116. Strings will meet in room 114.

How will my child get there?

Instrumental music students ride the middle school bus that is going through their neighborhood. Most pick-ups are between 7:10 – 7:30 AM. After class, a Monroe Public School bus will take students back to their respective elementary schools. You can find the bus number, bus stop location and the time of pick up of the **Middle School** bus going through your neighborhood by going to www.monroe.k12.mi.us and clicking on the quick link to bus routes. When asked for grade, you'll need to enter 7 or 8. If you can't find your bus stop there, call the transportation department at 265-3300. Students can use their elementary cafeteria accounts to buy breakfast in morning from the middle school cafeteria.

What if there is a school delay?

In the event of a delay for any reason, beginning instrumental music classes are CANCELLED for the day.
