Arborwood conducted a comprehensive needs assessment by utilizing information from the SPR 40 and student data analysis process. In addition, parents were surveyed as part of a districtwide parent survey process. Throughout the school year, Arborwood conducts professional learning community sessions where teachers review and analyze student work and other types of assessment data to make decisions about student progress.

2. What were the results of the comprehensive needs assessment process? What information was concluded as a result of analyzing perception, student achievement, school programs/process, and demographic data?

As a result of the comprehensive needs assessment process, Arborwood has established achievement goals and objectives directly related to the improvement of achievement for subgroup populations within the school with the intent to close achievement gaps for learning in the four core content areas.

3. How are the school goals connected to priority needs and the needs assessment process? It is clear that a detailed analysis of multiple types of data was conducted to select the goals.

It was concluded as a result of our comprehensive needs assessment that students in certain subgroup populations need instruction that is designed to meet their individual needs. Teachers need assistance with differentiating instruction.

4. How do the goals address the needs of the whole school population? How is special recognition paid to meeting the needs of children who are disadvantaged?

Goals reflect a need to target instruction. We target instruction through our interest academy and method of inquiry. We also carefully plan interventions that will help grow student reading, writing and math scores. We use Dreambox for math interventions and LLI for reading. We offer after-school programs for additional help for students

We provide ongoing PD for Targeted instruction and for tech integration. Our teachers will be studying classroom discourse this year during their PLC time. We feel that through classroom discourse, students will be engaged in the learning process by questioning, synthesizing, reflecting, speaking and/or writing.

2. Describe how the research-based methods and strategies in the schoolwide plan increase the quality and quantity of instruction (which accelerates and enriches the curriculum).

We will continue the culture of coaching within our school. The Plan/Teach/Debrief method will allow teachers to plan effective lessons that will engage all students in the learning process. Teachers will be able to address the individual needs of students, promote classroom culture where students are engaged in discourse and the teacher asks effective questions to elicit involvement by all students in the class

3. Describe how the research-based reform strategies in the schoolwide plan align with the findings of the comprehensive needs assessment.

We have aligned our SIP to the following four strategies: Parent Engagement, Tech integration, Positive school culture and Targeted Instruction. Each member of our staff is involved in one or more of these strategies in developing our plan for the school. The overall goal is to increase student engagement.

During Academy time we have assigned interventionist to work with small group of student on areas that have been identified as a need for intervention. An intervention plan is developed for each student and their progress is monitored as they go. Based on data, students can be invited to an after school reading program for further intervention

We collect data based off the interventions. Teachers and interventionists progress monitor 3-5 times per week. We also use district common assessment results and our SAT team meets every 2 weeks to review results of struggling students
