Custer Elementary conducted the Comprehensive Needs Assessment by utilizing information from the SPR 40 and student analysis process. In addition parents, students and staff are surveyed. Throughout the school year, Custer conducts professional learning communities when all staff analyzes MSTEP and local assessment data to make decisions about student progress.

Custer has established achievement goals and objectives directly related to the improvement and achievement for sub group populations within the school. The intent to close the achievement gaps for learning in the four content areas is the primary goal..

3. How are the school goals connected to priority needs and the needs assessment process? It is clear that a detailed analysis of multiple types of data was conducted to select the goals.

The data supports that there is a need to improve student levels of achievement in ELA, Math, Science and Social Studies. Specifically a priority of the school is to improve reading achievement in grades K-2. Data is analyzed from MSTEP and local district assessments in all core areas. The data is inputted and utilized in Schoolzilla. The data is used to determine the goals, strategies, and activities in this plan. The percent increase of scores is based on the goal of achieving 85% proficiency.

4. How do the goals address the needs of the whole school population? How is special recognition paid to meeting the needs of children who are disadvantaged?

The goals reflect a need to provide professional development for targeted instruction. Sub group data have been analyzed and targeted through Tier 1 and Tier 2 and Tier 3 instruction. Using best practices during Tier 1 instruction is valuable for all students.

The school has offered a variety of professional development throughout the school year. This summer three online book studies are talking place using Google Classroom. The school also offers a mentorship program that meets once a month to go over a variety of topics. With grade level common planning there are ample time to have collaboration time between team members.

The district has offered job embedded professional development. There are several summer institutes available for teachers to take part in.

Teachers are offered SCHEChs for their participation in professional development. There is also a Wellness and Positive Action Committee.

Custer had a low turnover rated. Four out of the five teachers left because of retirement.

PD for Targeted Instruction - Ongoing, job-embedded professional development will be provided to all instructional staff with a focus on the use of data to improve student achievement in Science for all students including subgroup populations.
