Monroe Middle School conducted a comprehensive needs assessment by utilizing information from the Pre and post common assessment data, I-Ready scores, CA-60 review analysis process. All stakeholders were surveyed as part of a district wide survey process. Throughout the school year Monroe Middle School conducted professional learning community sessions where teachers review and analyze student work and common assessment data to make decisions about student growth. We also have a math and Writing/Reading Interventionist that work with students daily. MMS provides a healthy snack and transportation home after Student Success Time.

2. What process was used to identify children who are failing or most at risk of failing to meet the state core curriculum standards in the four core academic areas?

Monroe Middle School as a result of the comprehensive needs assessment process has established goals and objectives related to the improvement of achievement for subgroup populations within the school with the intent to close achievement gaps for learning in the four core content areas. All students were given a common grade level pre and post test; in reading, math and writing. The results of the assessments formed our school improvement goals and strategies.

All students that are enrolled in Monroe Middle School are given the iReady Reading assessment and the iReady Math assessment, three times during the school year. Along with and a common writing assessment based on the common core units, This data is used to place students in best practice intervention based programs that are a part of their regular school day and extended learning opportunities. We have identified the bottom 30 percent of our population and they have daily communication with a post-secondary planner and an interventionist.

Professional Development has been infused with best practice strategies that enhance tier one instruction. All Target Title 1 students are retaught during their enrichment time. Interventions and the Students are monitored thru the work of the graduation coach working with individual students within the normal school day. Student Success Time is offered Monday through Thursday as an extended day activity. A late bus to provide transportation is a part of meeting their individual needs. We also offer summer school for all students who are interested.

The continued vision, mission and four year plan that MMS has been developed to meet the needs of our diverse learners. School and community collaboration within our school and outside community agencies. Parent Engagement - Parent room, parent engagement education series. After school tutoring meets the individual needs of each title 1 student. After school clubs and extended day learning opportunities. Along with Professional Development with staff that focuses on the school improvement goal s and working through the second year of our 4 year plan. Along with Twenty First Century learning skills taught with Technology that is embedded in daily instruction.

Learning opportunities in our science and social studies classes are connected to the core concepts of math and ELA. Students have the opportunities in their electives to apply the concepts from their core classes to go more in depth being guided by the inquiry process. Many of our elective classes allow our students to earn high school credit. This opportunity for students allows them to begin working on a career pathway a year earlier.

Our school operates as a school within a school learning environment. The only students that are pulled out of targeted intervention time are students that would benefit from targeted instruction in a small group during instructional support.

All of our data, including building common assessments, iReady scores are stored and mined through Schoolzilla.

All students are given a pre and post assessment within the core curriculum/exploratory and also are given the iReady in math and reading at the beginning of the school year and then again based on the trimester schedule to monitor meeting the needs of the eligible targeted title 1 students. LLI will also be used in our ELA interventionists classroom. Professional development has focused primarily on Tier 1 instruction to meet the needs of targeted title 1 students. Interventionists, Post secondary planners and student service providers work with their caseload of their students on a daily and or weekly basis.

Teachers are involved in Professional Learning Communities that focus on the needs of our targeted Title 1 students. Teachers are involved in on-going professional development about meeting the needs of students. Teachers also attend bi monthly meetings to analyze data using the 80/20 rule in their instruction.

Professional Development for Targeted Instruction - Professional Development for Targeted Instruction - Ongoing, job embedded professional development will be provided to all instructional staff with the focus on the use of data to improve student achievement in mathematics for all students including subgroup populations.
