MONROE COUNTY JAIL INTENSIVE

OUTPATIENT PROGRAM (IOP): A program designed to provide substance abuse treatment to males and females while incarcerated in the Monroe County Jail. This intensive program is offered five days per week for four weeks. Participants attend group, lectures, workbook, support groups, and individual therapy.

MONROE COUNTY INMATE DORMITORY

RELAPSE PREVENTION PROGRAM (IOP) : A program designed to provide substance abuse relapse prevention to males while incarcerated in the Monroe County Inmate Dormitory. This intensive program is offered three days per week for four weeks. Participants attend group, lectures, and individual therapy.

DRIVERS LICENSE EVALUATIONS: The

State of Michigan requires that anyone who has lost driving privileges due to an alcohol and/or drug related driving offense must have an evaluation done as part of the reinstatement process. The evaluations are done by a licensed, qualified therapist and reports are completed and made available in a timely manner. A standard fee is charged for the evaluation.

VETERANS TRANSITIONAL HOUSING: The

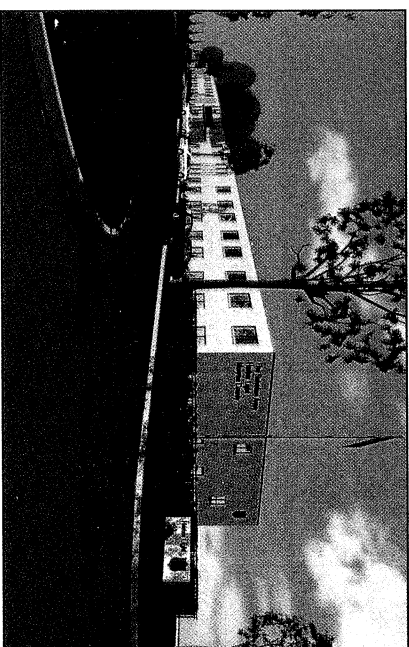
Southeast Michigan Veterans In Transition Program (SEMVIT) provides transitional housing and supportive services to male and female homeless veterans. The program is funded in part by a Homeless Providers Grant and Per Diem Program from the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) and provides linkages to local and federal veteran support services. MISSION

The purpose of the Harbor Light is to assist persons affected by addiction, homelessness and hunger in an environment conducive to profound change and spiritual growth.

The Monroe Harbor Light center is an integral part of the Harbor Light System in Southeastern Michigan. The Harbor Light in Monroe has been serving the community for over 30 years. A continuum of substance abuse related services are available to anyone meeting funding and eligibility criteria. Veteran specific programs are also available at the Monroe Harbor Light center. Persons enrolled in Harbor Light programs have access to spiritual counseling and Bible Study as part of their continuum of care.

CORE PROGRAMS

SCREENING-ASSESSMENT-REFERRAL-AND

FOLLOW-UP: Provides persons with a screening and assessment to identify severity of presenting problem(s), appropriate level of care and other services needed. Referrals are made with assistance in scheduling of appointments. Follow-up is done to check on status of persons receiving screening/assessment and referrals.

DETOXIFICATION:

Three to five days in duration to assist an individual in withdrawing from alcohol and/or drugs in a sub-acute environment

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT:

A program where the person is housed in a structured environment. Treatment includes individual, group, didactic lectures and support groups. Length of stay ranges from thirty to ninety days based on funding source

DAY TREATMENT:

An intensive outpatient program for individuals that can live in a supportive community environment and attend four and one half hours of therapy - four days a week - four week duration.

OUTPATIENT: An outpatient program is for persons who need minimal structure or support while in treatment. Persons appropriate for outpatient may have no treatment experience, but can remain substance free for a period of time or may have had prior treatment experience, but are experiencing relapse issues or as follow-up to residential or day treatment. Outpatient treatment may include individual/family sessions, group therapy and/or educational lectures.

SPECIALTY PROGRAMS

DEAF AND HARD OF HEARING PROGRAM:

A state wide program that offers substance abuse treatment to individuals that are deaf or hard of hearing. Programs offered are detoxification, intensive outpatient with a domiciliary component and outpatient.

PROBATION RESIDENTIAL CENTER (PRC):

A non treatment residential program that provides case management services.

They receive assistance in applying for insurance and obtaining food and clothing. The expectation is \$420 per month in self-pay after the first 60 days.

CALL TO ACTION

TO REDUCE RX DRUG AND HEROIN ABUSE IN MONROE COUNTY

MEDICAL WORKGROUP PROGRESS

The Monroe County Prosecutor's Office and the Monroe County Substance Abuse Coalition collaborated to hold their first Drug Summit in 2013. This summit was designed to increase awareness, provide educational information and develop a comprehensive action plan to address the problem of prescription drug and heroin abuse.

A Call to Action was developed by incorporating ideas from the entire community. Workgroups were formed to implement the plan in the following areas: (1) Prevention and Awareness, (2) Medical Community, (3) Law Enforcement/Government and (4) Treatment and Recovery.

As we move forward, our community will continue to work together to address the problem of prescription drug and heroin abuse.

- **PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION** - Provided numerous CME and professional development opportunities for physicians, nurses and medical personnel on pain management and addiction
- **STATE OPIOID TASK FORCE** - Provided significant input and testimony to Governor Snyder's task force on recommended actions to combat the prescription drug abuse epidemic at a statewide level, including recommendations for legislation to support the improvement and utilization of the Michigan Automated Prescription System (MAPS)
- **LEGISLATIVE OUTREACH** - Advocated for improved functionality and necessary funding that has led to an entirely new prescription monitoring system that has been implemented and used across the state
- Advocating and providing education on necessary MAPS improvements that has led to Senate Bill 47, a bill to remove reporting exemptions in MAPS
- **COMMUNITY EDUCATION** - Provided education and advocacy on new and emerging prescription drug issues, such as Zohydro, Narcan and MAPS. These efforts drastically limited the introduction of a new opioid with a high susceptibility of abuse
- **LOCAL ROUNDTABLE** - Initiated the "Monroe Community Collaborative" - a quarterly roundtable discussion between ProMedica staff, Monroe County Health Department, Monroe County Prosecutor's Office, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, law enforcement and schools to provide an open, informal setting to greater communicate and collaborate on issues affecting all agencies
- **PRENATAL EDUCATION** - Implemented prenatal infant substance abuse exposure and screening protocols ensuring a consistent approach for treatment of addicted mothers during pregnancy and delivery
- Establishment of "Hope for Healthy Babies" which provides education for any pregnant woman who is experiencing issues with substance abuse
- **FIRST RESPONDER TRAINING** - Develop Naloxone (Narcan) protocols for first responders and equipped medical first responders with Narcan kits and training
- **PAIN MANAGEMENT POLICY** - Implemented a new pain management policy and Opiate Risk Assessment Tool (OPRAT) into the electronic health record system at ProMedica Monroe Regional Hospital
- Monitor installed in the waiting area of Emergency Room which displays resources and data related to prescription drug and treatment information
- **PRESCRIBER EDUCATION** - Developed a prescriber education packet for all Monroe County physicians
- **MEDICATION DISPOSAL BOXES IN PROMEDICA** - Ohio's response as one of the activities to combat opioid crisis. Monroe County's process was shared, and the boxes used within ProMedica will be of similar design to Monroe County. ProMedica Monroe Regional Hospital will be exempt from installing a box due to the Red Med boxes already in place
- **MAPS INTERFACE WITH EPIC/E-MAR** - Work underway, likely not complete until late 2018



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LAW ENFORCEMENT WORKGROUP PROGRESS

- **PRIORITIZE RESOURCES** – Law Enforcement focused on the investigation, arrest and prosecution of Drug Dealers suspected of selling prescription drugs and heroin
- Prosecutor's Office reassigned a Senior Trial Attorney to prosecute felony drug cases and expanded after-hours access for law enforcement allowing 24/7 contact with this assistant prosecutor
- **VICE UNIT** – Monroe City Police established a new drug interdiction team to focus on street-level investigations
- **ADDITIONAL FUNDING** – Secured support and funding for additional enforcement positions (three additional Sheriff's Deputies, one additional Assistant Prosecutor, one additional DEA Officer and one additional undercover officer for MANTIS)
- **NARCAN** – Michigan State Police, MANTIS, Monroe County Sheriff's Office, Monroe City Police and most local police agencies now trained and using naloxone (Narcan)
- **DRUG OVERDOSE DEATH PROTOCOL** – Prosecutor's Office developed county-wide drug overdose death investigative protocol outlining procedure for law enforcement to use when responding to a prescription drug or heroin overdose
- **BILLBOARD CAMPAIGN** – Partnered with Crime Stoppers and secured private donations to fund the "Report Heroin Dealers" billboard campaign
- **EDUCATION** – Provided numerous law enforcement presentations to local high school students and community organizations on prescription drug abuse and heroin addiction
- Developed training for local retailers on how to respond and report suspected drug abuse in their establishment
- Mailed educational information on how to report suspected illegal drug activity to every household in Monroe County
- Probation Department developed a substance abuse accountability statement to ensure MAPS utilization and medication use disclosure
- **LOCAL ROUNDTABLE** – Assistant Prosecutor assigned to represent DHHS along with law enforcement agencies participate in quarterly roundtable discussion with ProMedica staff, Monroe County Health Department, Michigan Department of Health and Human Services and schools to provide an open, informal setting for greater communication and collaboration on issues affecting all agencies
- **STATE OPIOID TASK FORCE** – Provided testimony to Governor Snyder's task force outlining efforts taken by local coalition and advocated for changes in state policy to improve prevention, treatment, medical and enforcement strategies
- **MONROE INTENSIVE DRUG ADDICTION SUPERVISION PROGRAM** – Formed unique, community-based intensive drug addiction supervision program in collaboration with the local judiciary, sheriff's office, Michigan Department of Corrections, Monroe County Community Corrections, local defense bar, Salvation Army Harbor Light and a cross-section of community groups and organizations. MIDAS Panel recently met with first participant and should formally introduce full program to public in January 2018



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TREATMENT & RECOVERY PROGRESS

- **RESOURCE GUIDE** - Developed a countywide Substance Abuse Treatment Resource Guide that can be found at www.unitedwaymlc.org
- Updated meeting schedules are available quarterly and include all AA, NA, and HA meetings in Monroe County
- **EDUCATION** - Professional Development for human service professionals from multiple agencies on how to make client referrals and what treatment options are available, understanding the disease model of addiction and importance of removing the stigma attached to addiction, and an explanation of what recovery resources are available to assist clients in maintaining recovery
- Developed an educational guide on understanding the 12-Step Recovery Program
- **ACCESSING TREATMENT** - Moved substance abuse assessment access points from outside of Monroe County to three points within the County
- **PREGNANT WOMEN** - Developed and implemented the "Hope for Healthy Babies" treatment and recovery group for pregnant women experiencing issues with addiction
- Women Specialty Services are now available in Monroe County through CCSEM to specifically address women specific substance use issues
- **FAMILY SERVICES** - Developed and implemented a monthly Family Substance Abuse Education Series for family and friends affected by addiction to help families understand addiction as a disease, signs and symptoms of addiction, enable addictive behaviors, how to start a conversation about substance use, treatment modalities and individual needs
- **YOUTH SERVICES** - Expanded Adolescent Substance Abuse and Family Support Services through CCSEM offering individual counseling, case management, in-home family sessions and parent education specific to Adolescents and addiction
- Adolescent Recovery groups offered as part of the adolescent substance use program
- **PEER SUPPORT** - CCAR certified Recovery Peer Support trainers located at SAHL and CCSEM - This expanded peer support programming provides a hands-on approach to the treatment and recovery process by mentoring and supporting individuals new to recovery
- Recovery Peer Supports located on site at Family Medical Center
- Recovery Peer Supports are available through Catholic Charities of Southeast Michigan, Salvation Army Harbor Light, Passion of Mind, Paula's House and Touchstone Recovery Homes
- **COORDINATION OF SERVICES** - Coordination of Primary Care and Psychiatric services with Family Medical Center and ProMedica Residency Center
- SAHL provides ProMedica Residency Center residents the opportunity to train onsite with clinical and medical staff.
- **MAT** - Medication Assisted Treatment utilizing vivitrol is available through all treatment levels of care at SAHL



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PREVENTION WORKGROUP PROGRESS

- **COMMUNITY EDUCATION** - Provided multiple community educational presentations to human service agencies, senior centers and civic organizations
- Provided teacher in-service, classroom education and school board trainings on prescription drug and heroin prevention
- Child Impact Team formed to address pre-natal and post-natal exposure to substances
- Rethink Addiction 5K run organized to raise awareness and funding to fight opioid addiction
- **"SAFE DISPOSAL" PROGRAM** - Organized community-wide "medication take-back" events which collected over 85,000 units of controlled substances
- Medication Take-Backs are now part of Health Checks sponsored by United Way of Monroe/Lenawee Counties
- **RED MED DISPOSAL BOXES** - Installed six medication disposal bins at law enforcement offices throughout Monroe County where approximately 800 - 1000 pounds of unused and expired medications from EACH of the six RED MED disposal bins have been collected every year
- Monroe County Commissioners continue to declare a day each June as "Prescription Drug Abuse Awareness Day" to raise awareness and educate residents on the importance of properly disposing of medications
- Public Service Announcement created by Coalition Chair and Treasurer to promote the usage of the Red Med Disposal Boxes
- **STUDENT PREVENTION LEADERSHIP TEAMS** - Establishment of SPLT in all twelve local schools enables students to create prevention campaigns targeting their peers
- Student leaders received training and education to implement a "Prescription Pill Awareness" campaign with a \$500.00 stipend available to assist each school
- Public Service Announcements created by SPLT for their "Operation Prevention Campaign" were shown in local movie theaters
- Monroe County Superintendents passed a resolution to incorporate prescription drug and heroin prevention curriculum into the school year for all middle and high school students in the nine public districts
- **"SAFER LOCK" CAMPAIGN** - Distributed Medication Safe Storage and Disposal Campaign information to all 28 Monroe County Pharmacies
- Prevention education presentations provided to Monroe County Senior Center's on safe medication storage, use and disposal
- **FIRST RESPONDERS** - Created "First Responder Sheets" for EMS, police and fire personnel containing substance abuse treatment resource materials for immediate distribution to residents when on scene where substance abuse is a factor
- **STATE OPIOID TASK FORCE** - Advocated for State-level policy change to support improved prevention, treatment and enforcement strategies, including providing testimony to the Governor's Prescription Drug Task Force
- **LEGISLATIVE OUTREACH** - Worked with State Legislators to develop legislation requiring Michigan Automated Prescription System utilization
- **FAMILY EDUCATION** - Parent Awareness component to the "Prescription Pill Awareness Campaign" which highlights advocating for their child when seeking medical treatment "You Decide Before they Prescribe"
