Dear Trojans!

We are looking forward to your return, and we are excited about new opportunities we have to offer. As many of you know, this school year we are making some significant changes to scheduling. Not only are we moving to semesters with block rotation, but we are also introducing Achieve Time.

We know change can be tough, but we really believe that these changes will provide you with an optimal education experience that will allow you to grow your talents, explore your interests, and get the help you need most. The adjustment won't always be easy, but I encourage you to consider what you have to gain rather than focus on what you may be giving up. Hopefully the information in this note will help alleviate some anxiety about the scheduling process and clarify some points of confusion or frustration.

In regards to scheduling Achieve Time, you will report to your TFT during the Achieve Time hour for the first two weeks of school (see attached schedule). In addition to helping you adjust to the block schedule, your TFT teacher will guide you through looking at the Achieve Time offering and selecting those which best fit you and your needs.

That said, I want to make you are aware of a few scheduling issues we noted from registration.

First, Juniors, many of you experienced long lines for counselors during registration, and I wanted to explain the source of that difficulty. Due to the required amount of material and a need to prep for the SAT, we decided to run Math 3 each day, all year. This generated scheduling complications for many students that required individual attention.

Another concern we want to make you aware of is the availability of seats for first-year Auto, Welding, and Construction classes. Due to their popularity, we had more requests for these classes than we have staff and seats. Hopefully, if you didn't get one of the these courses this year, you will next year.

If you have a schedule that is not complete or have questions, please stop into the Student Service Center through Friday by noon or email your counselor. This time of year requires patience. We will make a morning announcement on the first day of school to address any lingering scheduling concerns and provide instructions for how to proceed.
