Math 3B Syllabus

Miss Oddo - Room B-216

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Course Description

This is a continuation of the Core-Plus Mathematics curriculum. Students will focus this semester on: Polynomial/Rational Functions, Circular Motion, Logarithm/Inverse functions and Sequential Change.

Grading Policy

Grades will be on a 4-point standard base grading scale.

- A score of 3 or 4 means the student's knowledge meets or exceeds expectations.
- A score of 1 or 2 means the student's knowledge is not yet sufficient.

Grading

Your grade will be calculated as follows:

- 90% from learning targets each assessment replaces the previous score.
- 10% from investigation/homework

Late Work

All work is due the next class period. All work, for a unit, must be turned in no later than the day of the unit assessment. Once the class takes the assessment, NO work from that unit will be accepted.

Folders

Your folder is where you will keep all your notes and investigation/unit work. It is important for you to keep this up-to-date. If you are absent, you will be able to get all the information you missed from my webpage. You will be able to use your folders on quizzes. You CANNOT use them on unit tests.

Investigation Work

You will be completing the work for this class in your groups <u>during class</u>. If you do not finish the work in class, you are to complete it at home. You are expected to participate FULLY with your group.

Quizzes

You will be taking multiple quizzes during each unit in which you will be able to use your folders. If you are absent the day of a quiz, for any reason, you will take the quiz <u>in class</u> the day you return. If you are late for class on the day of a quiz, you will NOT receive any extra time.

Unit Tests

Assessments will be given at the end of each unit. You **CANNOT** use your folder on the test. These assessments must be completed within the allotted class period. If you are absent the day of a test, for any reason, you will take the test <u>in class</u> the day you return. All students will have the opportunity to reassess any unit test. Any re-assessment on a test MUST be taken after school or during Achieve Time <u>within one week</u> from the day the original test was given. In addition, you MUST meet with me during achieve time or after school to go over your original test before the re-assessment is taken. The reassessment score will be the score kept for your grade for those learning targets.

Absences

When you are absent from class, for ANY reason, it is YOUR responsibility to get missed materials and assignments from my webpage. Once a student has been absent 8 times, students can earn credit of a D-as a grade in the course only if the student has continued to come to class and completes the required work to meet the proficiency level of a passing grade. If a student continues to miss class and/or does not complete the required work, they will NOT receive credit for the course.

Extra Help

You can sign up during achieve time to get extra help needed to be successful in the class. I will also be available Monday – Thursday after school from 2:15 - 3:30 for any additional help.

Classroom Expectations

- 1. Be in your seat with all necessary supplies when the bell rings.

 Consequence: Any students not in the room when the bell rings will be considered tardy.
- 2. You should not stand at the door in anticipation of the dismissal bell. You need to remain seated until the bell rings.

Consequence: You will be the last to leave the room.
